CARTER (CONT)- Jaffa. Lieutenant Tyler went down covering our six, and Colonel O'Neill went back for him.
- 01.23.05 TEAL'C- We must assemble a rescue team and return to the planet immediately,...  
TEAL'C (OS CONT)- General Hammond.
- 01.25.29 HAMMOND- Hold on. Who's Lieutenant Tyler?
- 01.29.00 DANIEL- What do you mean who's Lieutenant Tyler? He's a member of SG-1.
- 01.30.29 HAMMOND- What?
- 01.32.13 DANIEL- You assigned him yourself last month, sir.
- 01.37.13 CARTER- Tyler, sir, we've been training him for weeks. This was his third mission.
- 01.41.18 HAMMOND- Major, but I have no idea what you're talking about.
- 03.01.01 O'NEILL- We've got to move, Lieutenant. Can you walk?
- 03.04.15 TYLER- I can try.
- 03.07.03 O'NEILL- All right. Let's go.

03.15.08           TEAL’C- General Hammond, we must return to the planet immediately.

03.17.07           HAMMOND- No one’s going anywhere until I find out exactly what happened.

03.20.24           CARTER- Colonel O’Neill Lieutenant Tyler were cut off from the gate. I already told  
                          you, sir.

03.24.23           HAMMOND (OVERLAPPING)- And I’m telling you, I’ve never heard of this Lieutenant  
                          Tyler.

03.27.04           DANIEL- How can you say that?

03.29.15           HAMMOND- I think you should report to the infirmary.

03.31.20           CARTER- Sir, there’s nothing wrong with us.

03.33.00           HAMMOND- We’ll leave that up to Dr. Fraiser.

03.34.22           DANIEL (OS)- General!  
                          DANIEL (CONT)- Jack is trapped on that planet.

03.36.20           HAMMOND- Sergeant, escort them to the infirmary.

03.41.14           CARTER- With or without reinforcements, we are going back sir.

03.43.28           HAMMOND- The hell you are. Relinquish your weapons. (beat) Air men.  
                      HAMMOND (OS CONT)- Major Carter, I will authorize the...  
                      HAMMOND (CONT)- use of force if you relinquish those weapons immediately.

04.29.09           O'NEILL- Ah, you are heavier than you look.

04.32.22           TYLER- Sorry, sir.

04.33.27           O'NEILL- That's no problem. How's the leg?

04.47.03           TYLER (OS)- It's no problem.

04.51.15           O'NEILL- Yeah, right.

05.17.25           TYLER- What is this place?

05.20.00           O'NEILL- Well, I wouldn't buy a time share, but it's ah, defensible.

05.25.06           TYLER- Until Major Carter returns?

05.27.04           O'NEILL- Yeah, Major Carter and a whole lot of her friends.

- 05.33.08 TYLER- Colonel,...
- TYLER (OS CONT)- you could've made it to the gate.
- TYLER (CONT)- You came back for me.
- 05.40.10 O'NEILL- What's your point?
- 05.42.03 TYLER- Well, I guess I'm grateful.
- 05.45.11 O'NEILL- Well, I wasn't gonna let you die, Lieutenant. It's like...a ton of paperwork.
- 05.51.28 TYLER- Paperwork?
- 05.55.09 O'NEILL- It's a joke. (beat) My way of deflecting attention from my own obvious  
heroism. (beat) You'll get used to it.
- 06.07.10 TYLER- All right. I understand.
- 06.13.05 O'NEILL- Right.
- 06.15.27 FRAISER (OS)- General Hammond.
- FRAISER (CONT)- Teal'c is going to be fine. It's a bad burn, but his sybiote should  
take care of it. (beat) Any word from Colonel O'Neill?

06.29.20 HAMMOND- We've been trying to raise him using the MALP as a relay, but apparently it's been disabled.

06.35.03 FRAISER- Well, I've completed my preliminary exam on Major Carter, Teal'c, and Daniel. And so far I found nothing wrong with them. I mean, they're obviously agitated,...

FRAISER (OS CONT)- but that's understandable given the circumstances.

06.44.07 HAMMOND- Doctor, three of my people have just come back from a mission talking about a lieutenant who doesn't exist. You can't tell me there's...

HAMMOND (OS CONT)- nothing wrong with them.

06.50.18 FRAISER (OVERLAPPING)- I can't explain it, sir.

06.52.06 HAMMOND- Some kind of hallucination.

06.54.13 FRAISER- Hallucinations aren't normally shared.

06.59.24 HAMMOND- There's never been a Tyler in this command.

07.01.29 FRAISER- Yes sir. And we're still waiting for test results.

07.05.11 HAMMOND- In the meantime, I want them quarantined in the infirmary.





07.55.25 CARTER- I don't think he's just saying it. I think he really doesn't remember.

07.59.10 DANIEL- Well, how can that be? Yesterday we were all in the briefing room for two hours going over the mission.

08.03.17 TEAL'C- I do not believe General Hammond would lie to us.

08.06.00 DANIEL- So, what, he's suffering from some kind of amnesia or...

08.08.04 CARTER- Well, if that's the case, they're all suffering from it. I mean, Dr. Fraiser didn't seem to remember him either.

08.13.16 TEAL'C- Perhaps General Hammond is correct. Perhaps there is something wrong with us.

08.19.12 DANIEL- Okay, when I went through the quantum mirror on P3R233, I came back to a base that looked just like this one.

DANIEL (OS CONT)- Everything was exactly the same,...

DANIEL (CONT)- except no one knew who I was.

08.29.22 CARTER- Because Daniel Jackson, in that reality, never joined the SGC.

- 08.33.10 DANIEL- Right so what if this is a reality where Tyler never joined?  
DANIEL (OS CONT)- Or maybe he was killed in an...  
DANIEL (CONT)- earlier mission. Or maybe he was never even born.
- 08.41.16 CARTER- I don't know, Daniel. I mean there was nothing on 441 that even remotely resembled a quantum mirror.
- 08.46.20 TEAL'C- Perhaps a Stargate malfunction.
- 08.48.29 CARTER- Well, we've never had any evidence to suggest that the gate can access a parallel universe.
- 08.55.11 TEAL'C- If Lieutenant Tyler does exist in this reality, there would be a record of him in the base computer.
- 08.59.15 CARTER- Yeah. His personnel file. (beat) My access code isn't working. they must have decided that we were a security risk and locked us out.
- 09.19.15 DANIEL- So you can't get in.
- 09.21.06 CARTER- I didn't say that.
- 09.29.14 O'NEILL (OS)- Where's your weapon, Lieutenant?

09.31.26 TYLER- I'm sorry, sir. I dropped it when I got hit.

09.36.10 O'NEILL- All right, well, we've still got four mags, two clips, Little C4, some grenades  
and a launcher.

09.42.10 TYLER- Is that enough?

09.44.26 O'NEILL- Ah, it's a start.

09.50.16 CARTER- There's no record of a Lieutenant Tyler on active duty at the SGC.

09.54.26 DANIEL- That's impossible.

09.55.27 CARTER- Well, even day-pass visitors are logged in. There is no way he could have  
been on the base and not be in the computer. I configured a search for the  
name Tyler anywhere in...

CARTER (OS CONT)- the database. Nothing.

10.05.21 DANIEL- Well obviously somebody's wrong here. Could it be us?

10.09.05 CARTER- I think we have to admit the possibility.

10.11.10 TEAL'C- In either case O'Neill remains in danger.

- 10.16.02 CARTER- Wait a minute. This is weird.  
CARTER (OS CONT)- Somebody else configured an identical...  
CARTER (CONT)- search less than an hour ago. Somebody outside the base.
- 10.23.07 DANIEL- Someone outside the base? How do you know that?
- 10.25.02 CARTER- Because it's not a base ID. It's just a user number.  
CARTER (OS CONT)- 4574. Oh, he's been busy. Over the past two weeks he's  
accessed a number...  
CARTER (CONT)- of secure files. Mission logs, briefings, personnel files.
- 10.43.09 DANIEL- Ah, whose personnel files?
- 10.48.10 CARTER- Ours.
- 11.16.16 O'NEILL- All right, listen up. We've got a couple of MRE'S left, but we're running short  
on water. I'm gonna check the area. (beat) Take the P90. Here.
- 11.30.22 TYLER- Wouldn't it be safer just to wait?  
TYLER (OS CONT)- Major Carter and the others should be coming soon.
- 11.34.23 O'NEILL- Well, the truth is, they should have been here by now. Something must've  
happened.

- 11.38.04 TYLER- Are you saying they're not coming for us?
- 11.39.04 O'NEILL (OS)- No.  
O'NEILL (CONT)- I'm just saying it might take a little longer than we thought.
- 11.42.09 TYLER- What if they never made it back?
- 11.43.29 O'NEILL- Then General Hammond will send someone else.
- 11.46.06 TYLER- How do you know?
- 11.47.01 O'NEILL (OS)- Because,...
- O'NEILL (CONT)- Lieutenant, we don't leave our people behind. You should know that.
- 11.52.23 TYLER- Yes sir.
- 11.54.20 O'NEILL- Good. (beat) Stay off the radio. Keep the channel open. I'll give you three clicks when I'm on my way back. So don't shoot me.
- 12.07.07 TYLER- I won't.
- 12.26.24 HAMMOND- Sergeant?



- 13.28.12           TECHNICIAN TWO- Sir, we lost the signal.
- 13.30.02           HAMMOND- He said Tyler. Obviously, he's been affected by the same hallucination  
                          as the rest of SG-1. That rules out sending a retrieval team until we know more.
- 13.41.01           TECHNICIAN TWO- Well, sir, if you would like, we can try sending a second UAV.
- 13.44.18           SIMMONS- I don't know if that's a good idea, General. Those things aren't cheap.
- 13.49.00           HAMMOND- Colonel Simmons.
- 13.51.08           SIMMONS- Think you might want to take a look at that.
- 13.52.22           HAMMOND- My office. (beat) Colonel, I understand you've been ordered to  
                          investigate a security problem?
- 14.03.04           SIMMONS- Well, sir, when three members of your best team start voicing concerns for  
                          their imaginary friend,...
- SIMMONS (OS CONT)- it does tend to raise some eyebrows.
- SIMMONS (CONT)- Your own report suggests there might be some sort of mind  
                          control.
- 14.11.29           HAMMOND- I have people working on it.



- 14.13.07           SIMMONS- Oh, I'm sure you do. But we think that a independent investigation is called for. I'm sure we'll have your full cooperation. (beat) You can use the red phone if you'd like sir. But one day you're going to play that card once too often.
- 14.29.14           HAMMOND- Colonel, I have an officer trapped off world, and there's nothing I can do for him until I get to the bottom of this.
- 14.35.15           SIMMONS- Well then, sir, you should welcome my help. (beat) Oh, Dr. Jackson. Sit down.
- 14.58.08           DANIEL- Why?
- 15.01.28           SIMMONS- Well, I thought I'd give you an opportunity to explain what happened on that planet?
- 15.05.15           DANIEL- I filed a report.
- 15.08.16           SIMMONS- Yes. You did. And a very interesting read it is. Full of amazing events and fictional characters. Sit down.
- 15.35.27           FRAISER- Wait a minute. Let me see that.

15.46.14 MEDICAL TECHNICIAN- Dr. Fraiser? We got the blood work and DNA results. No anomalies detected.

15.52.02 FRAISER- Thank you. (beat) I found this residue on Teal'c's jacket. I want you to have this analyzed.

15.57.28 MEDICAL TECHNICIAN- Yes, doctor.

16.15.12 SIMMONS (OS)- This is a videotape...of

SIMMONS (CONT)- your briefing before the mission to P7S441.

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- I see the four members of SG-1 team. I see Dr. Fraiser. I see General Hammond.

SIMMONS (CONT)- But I don't see any lieutenants.

16.29.01 DANIEL- This could be any briefing.

16.30.09 SIMMONS- Take a look at the time code.

16.34.20 DANIEL- This is a waste of time.

16.40.15 SIMMONS- This is not a waste of time, this is an official investigation.

16.44.00 DANIEL- Oh no, I mean, I get it. We obviously have Lieutenant Tyler issues. I mean I say he exists. You say he doesn't.

- 16.50.18           SIMMONS- This is not just about Lieutenant Tyler.
- 16.52.26           DANIEL- Someone else doesn't exist?
- 16.56.29           SIMMONS- I'd like you...  
SIMMONS (OS CONT)- to explain your relationship with ah, Dr. Sarah Gardner.
- 17.09.18           DANIEL- What does that have to do with this?
- 17.12.13           SIMMONS- Dr. Jackson, I'm here to investigate potential alien influences over  
                          Stargate Command.  
SIMMONS (OS CONT)- The fact that a Goa'uld has taken...  
SIMMONS (CONT)- your ex-girlfriend as a host has everything to do with this.
- 17.24.09           DANIEL- What?
- 17.28.06           SIMMONS- You were very close at one time.
- 17.30.00           DANIEL- That's none of your business.
- 17.30.28           SIMMONS (OS)- You're...  
SIMMONS (CONT)- entire life is our business.
- 17.33.01           DANIEL- Do I need to call an attorney?

- 17.36.04           SIMMONS- Serious questions have been raised about your viability as a member of this command. I am giving you an opportunity to respond.
- 17.42.00           DANIEL- Okay, respond. Fine. I lost someone I care about. And not for the first time I might add. You think that makes me sympathetic to the Goa'uld?
- 17.52.22           SIMMONS- I think that makes you someone whose judgment could be easily clouded. And for a man in your position, that's unacceptable.
- 18.03.12           DANIEL- What's your position again?
- 18.13.26           FRAISER- I need to speak to Major Carter. Thank you.
- 18.27.23           CARTER- What's going on, Janet?
- 18.28.28           FRAISER (OS)- I need to ask you something.  
FRAISER (CONT)- This Lieutenant Tyler you keep talking about...what does he look like?
- 18.36.17           CARTER- African American,...  
CARTER (OS CONT)- mid-twenties.
- 18.38.26           FRAISER- About five ten, five eleven? (beat) I'm not sure but I, I think I remember him.

- 18.46.26 CARTER- Two hours ago you said you'd never heard of him.
- 18.48.24 FRAISER- I know. I, I can't explain it, but I can remember his face.
- 18.52.24 CARTER- Does anyone else remember him?
- 18.54.12 FRAISER- I don't know.
- 18.58.27 CARTER- Okay, maybe something did happen to us, but you were never on that planet.
- 19.06.27 FRAISER- I have to report this to General Hammond.
- 19.09.06 CARTER (OS)- Janet, wait.  
CARTER (CONT)- If you come forward now, they'll start suspecting you as well. You need to find evidence.
- 19.17.22 FRAISER- Sam...
- 19.18.11 CARTER (OS OVERLAPPING)- As long as we're locked up in here, we can't...  
CARTER (CONT)- do anything to help Colonel O'Neill. It's up to you.

19.38.06           HAMMOND- I would like to speak to General Eastman. This is George Hammond. I would like to know who this man is working for. I appreciate that sir. I need to know. I know, Mr. Secretary, I wouldn't be making this call if I didn't consider it a matter of the utmost importance. Yes, I know he's in a meeting with the joint-chiefs, do you have any idea when he might become available? I see. All right. Thank you.

20.45.05           O'NEILL- Where are you from, Tyler?

20.48.11           TYLER- Texas, mostly. We moved around a lot. You?

20.58.03           O'NEILL- Born in Chicago, raised in Minnesota.

21.03.14           TYLER- Is it nice there?

21.06.27           O'NEILL- Is it nice there? Do you know what the Goa'uld really want from us?  
Minnesota, that's what. For the fishing mostly.

O'NEILL (OS CONT)- I'll take you sometime.

21.23.07           TYLER- Fishing?

21.24.09           O'NEILL- Oh, yeah. Ask Teal'c. He can't get enough.

21.33.13           TYLER- When do you think we'll get out of here, sir?

- 21.36.06 O'NEILL- Well, if not tomorrow, we'll head up into the hills and wait till the Jaffa lose interest.
- 21.44.01 TYLER- They'll never stop hunting us.
- 21.49.19 O'NEILL- What makes you say that?
- 21.52.28 TYLER- Isn't that the way they are?
- 22.00.14 O'NEILL-That may be the way they are, but we're the way we are, so...there you are.  
Get some sleep.
- 22.30.04 SIMMONS (OS)- Tell me,...  
SIMMONS (CONT)- Teal'c, how does it feel knowing you betrayed your friends?
- 22.34.23 TEAL'C- I betrayed no one.
- 22.37.22 SIMMONS- You led Apophis into the mother ship which was occupied by SG-1, and the Tok'ra Selmak. You could have gotten them all killed.
- 22.47.26 TEAL'C- At the time, I was made to believe that my years with Tauri was a subterfuge.
- 22.51.27 SIMMONS- And now?

22.53.04 TEAL'C- I am loyal to the Tauri.

22.55.06 SIMMONS- Why should we believe you?

22.56.21 TEAL'C- If I were still loyal to the Goa'uld, you would know it.

22.59.11 SIMMONS- Really.

23.00.12 TEAL'C (OS)- It would be immediately apparent,...

TEAL'C (CONT)- as I would not to kill you where you sit.

23.34.24 O'NEILL- Ah, crap.

23.38.24 TYLER- What is it?

23.41.09 O'NEILL- Glider. Stay there.

24.21.10 TYLER- Nice shot.

24.23.00 O'NEILL- Where the hell did that come from?

24.24.19 TYLER (OS)- Could be the glider we saw...

TYLER (CONT)- leaving the area when we were checking out the crashed troop  
transport.



24.30.00 O'NEILL- Right. Anyway. It's made our position. Can you move?

24.37.15 TYLER- Not yet.

24.38.26 O'NEILL- Not yet. All right. Time to dig in.

24.48.28 SIMMONS (OS)- We have a problem here, Major. You say that this was your third op  
with Lieutenant Tyler,...

SIMMONS (CONT)- but based on your own report of ah, SG-1's last mission, you  
make absolutely no mention of his name.

25.01.09 CARTER- Daniel's name doesn't appear in all of my reports. It doesn't mean he  
wasn't there.

25.05.21 SIMMONS- Don't you think it's kind of odd that not a single person on this base can  
corroborate your story?

25.09.16 CARTER- Yes, I do. But what difference does it make? Colonel O'Neill is still out  
there.

25.14.04 SIMMONS- And you want us to send out a rescue team based on your word alone  
that he hasn't...

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- been compromised?

25.18.26 CARTER- We'll go ourselves.

25.19.25 SIMMONS (OS)- I,...

SIMMONS (CONT)- I'm afraid I can't trust you to do that.

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- You see, Dr. Jackson's motives for being here...

SIMMONS (CONT)- are colored by his emotions, and they always have been. Teal'c changes sides more often than I change the oil in my car.

25.32.16 CARTER- What about me?

25.33.28 SIMMONS- Well, let's see. You were briefly taken over as a host by the Goa'uld.

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- Once you fell under the control of an artificial...

SIMMONS (CONT)- intelligence of alien origin. And the last time we met you

harbored an alien in your own home. I'm beginning to wonder whether all of...

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- of this will have some sort of a residual effect.

SIMMONS (CONT)- Because just yesterday, for example, you violated base security by trying to get into one of the mainframes. I could nail you on that alone.

26.07.14 CARTER- You're user number 4574.

CARTER (OS CONT)- The one who's been accessing our personnel files.

CARTER (CONT)- You don't care about Tyler, you've just been waiting for something to use against us. Who are you getting your orders from, Colonel?

26.26.27 SIMMONS- This interview is over.

27.22.13 O'NEILL- The trips are set. Take the nine mil. If we get into it, make every shot count.

27.32.26 TYLER- I can't let you do this Colonel.

27.35.00 O'NEILL- Do what?

27.36.18 TYLER- I can't let you die protecting me.

27.44.22 HAMMOND- What have you got for us, Doctor?

17.47.11 FRAISER- Sir, I think I may have figured out what's been happening to SG-1.

FRAISER (OS CONT)- I found traces of a foreign chemical on Teal'c's uniform,...

FRAISER (CONT)- and I've completed my analysis.

27.57.15 HAMMOND- What is it?

- 27.58.19            FRAISER- Well, I'm not a hundred percent sure, but it's chemical structure...
- FRAISER (OS CONT)- closely resembles cortical acetylcholine, which is a neuro-  
   transmitter that helps regulate and process human memory. I...
- FRAISER (CONT)- believe that Lieutenant Tyler, or the idea of Lieutenant Tyler, is  
   nothing more than a chemical implant. Here, take a look.
- FRAISER (OS CONT)-You see, the effect is greatest here, in the temporal lobe  
   associated with face recognition. See, I think it's possible that SG-1...
- FRAISER (CONT)- encountered someone on the planet who exposed them to this  
   compound in order to convince them that he, she, or it was somehow familiar.
- 
- 28.31.22            HAMMOND- We're not talking about a vague sense of recognition,...
- HAMMOND (OS CONT)- we're talking about detailed memories that go back...
- HAMMOND (CONT)- weeks before they ever set foot on the planet.
- 
- 28.38.13            FRAISER- Yes sir. And obviously, their own minds provided the details necessary to  
   complete that illusion.
- 
- 28.42.18            SIMMONS- Didn't your first report say that their MRI's were clean?
- 
- 28.46.24            FRAISER- They were. The chemical dissipates fairly quickly.
- 
- 28.51.19            SIMMONS- So what's that?



- 29.59.15 TYLER (OS)- I exposed you to...  
TYLER (CONT)- a chemical that made you think I was one of your own.
- 30.02.08 O'NEILL (OS)- Whatever.  
O'NEILL (CONT)- Get back there.
- 30.04.00 TYLER- You don't believe me. Look at my leg.  
TYLER (OS CONT)- It's almost healed. Would this be possible if I were human?
- 30.13.12 O'NEILL- Would you get down?
- 30.15.26 TYLER- I'll show you.
- 30.22.11 O'NEILL- Jeez! What the hell is that?
- 30.26.28 TYLER (OS)- A glimpse of my true nature.
- 30.30.29 O'NEILL- You mean, what you really look like.

- 30.34.04 TYLER- It's a natural defense mechanism, a chemical we produce in our bodies.  
TYLER (OS CONT)- That's why I was a prisoner of the Jaffa. They were taking me to  
be dissected and studied.  
TYLER (CONT)- I managed to break out of my cell and damage the guidance system  
of the transport ship.  
TYLER (OS CONT)- We crashed on this planet. That's when you found me.  
TYLER (CONT)- I didn't know if you could be trusted.
- 30.55.10 O'NEILL- Well, you picked a helluva time to tell me.
- 30.57.14 TYLER- Please understand, Colonel.
- 31.41.19 O'NEILL- Hit the C4. Again.
- 32.24.20 TYLER- Behind you!
- 32.40.29 JAFFA #3- Hat'tak.
- 33.05.04 CARTER- I think we're all clear.  
CARTER (OS CONT)- You all right, sir?
- 33.08.00 O'NEILL- Fine. Teal'c.
- 33.15.24 TEAL'C- Lieutenant Tyler is not what he appears to be.

33.18.21 O'NEILL (OS)- I know.

O'NEILL (CONT)- He told me. Stand down. (beat) Let's go. (beat)

O'NEILL (OS)- Why didn't you just ask for help?

33.43.14 TYLER (OS)- I'm sorry, but I couldn't take the chance. For generations, the Reole  
have met with nothing but fear and mistrust.

33.50.05 O'NEILL- Well, sure, if you go around tricking people.

33.53.29 TYLER- My kind do not embrace technology. We have never been good fighters. Our  
ability to disguise ourselves is our only advantage. Now the Goa'uld are trying  
to learn our secrets. We're being hunted to extinction.

34.11.14 O'NEILL- You got some place to go?

34.14.00 TYLER- A group of us have started a new colony on a planet in an isolated part of the  
galaxy. After I return, we'll bury the gate and no one will ever hear of us again.

35.00.06 O'NEILL- What have we got?

35.01.29 TEAL'C- We are not alone.

35.24.22 O'NEILL- Looks like they're gonna be there awhile.







37.48.07 SIMMONS- Security of this country, sir.

37.49.13 HAMMOND (OS)- This investigation has nothing to do with...

HAMMOND (CONT)- the security of this country and you know it.

37.53.03 SIMMONS- Off world teams have been compromised.

SIMMONS (OS CONT)- Existing safeguards are ineffective.

SIMMONS (CONT)- SGC is an accident waiting to happen.

37.59.18 HAMMOND (OS)- I don't know who issued...

HAMMOND (CONT)- your orders, Simmons, but I've got a pretty good idea.

What matters is that in carrying out my orders, I have found things to be very wrong here.

HAMMOND (OS CONT)- to make a few phone calls. I learned enough...

HAMMOND (CONT)- to know your orders are politically motivated.

38.21.14 SIMMONS- I think you're missing my point. I don't care.

38.25.07 HAMMOND- If it's a fight you are looking for, my Washington connections go a lot higher than yours.

38.29.22           SIMMONS- Administrations change, sir.

38.31.14           HAMMOND (OS)- So...

HAMMOND (CONT)- do orders. Now do I need to have you escorted off my base?

38.37.19           SIMMONS- That won't be necessary, General. I know how to leave gracefully. I only  
                          hope you do.

38.54.22           CARTER (OS)- Daniel.

38.57.02           O'NEILL (OS)- Hey,...

O'NEILL (CONT)- where's Tyler?

39.01.02           DANIEL- You know, I would've asked him but I was too busy being unconscious after  
                          he shot me with that Zat you gave him, sir.

39.17.05           O'NEILL- Oh, for crying... (beat) He's trying to be a hero.

39.43.04           CARTER- There's only a few Jaffa left. We could take them out.

39.46.23           TEAL'C- This may be our best chance for escape, O'Neill.

- 41.39.16 O'NEILL (OS)- You're...
- O'NEILL (CONT)- lucky you're not really a lieutenant under my command. I'd have your ass for this.
- 41.43.29 TYLER- You could have escaped.
- 41.46.02 O'NEILL- We don't leave our people behind.
- 41.47.26 TYLER- But,...I am not one of your people.
- 41.53.29 O'NEILL- Could'a fooled me. Actually, you did fool me. (beat) Come on, let's go.
- 42.05.15 TYLER- What about the Jaffa at the gate?
